OUR JANUARY MEETING

Dr. Jatila van der Veen has been in the field of physics and astronomy education for nearly two decades, as a high school physics teacher, a lecturer in physics at UCSB, and as a Professor of Science Education at Purdue University-Calumet. She earned her Masters in Geophysics from Columbia University and her Doctorate in Education from UCSB. Her research in Education has focused on interdisciplinary arts-sciences education, math as a language, and applying research from sociolinguistics to improve physics education. Dr. van der Veen is currently a Visiting Project Scientist at the University of California, Santa Barbara, and serving as the E/PO Lead for the NASA collaborators on the Planck Mission She also teaches in the Interdisciplinary Studies program at the College of Creative Studies at UCSB. This fall she has begun a new collaboration with Professor JoAnn Kuchera-Morin, director of the AlloSphere at UCSB, to utilize the visualization and sonification capabilities of Virtual Reality to teach cosmology. Some of this research, as it applies to the Planck satellite cosmology mission, will be part of this evening's presentation.
