NASA's Deep Impact spacecraft is scheduled to impact Comet 9P/Tempel 1 on Sunday, July 3rd, at 11pm PDST. However, the spacecraft could make contact as early as impact 9pm that evening. The normally 10th magnitude comet should brighten as a result of the impact, and may even brighten to 6th magnitude, making it visible to the naked eye under dark sky conditions.
