He mainly works on the impact of novae on their stellar environments, detonations in helium layers, and probing the interiors of stars with asteroseismology. Much of this work involves computer simulations of stars, which leads to interesting visualizations of how they behave. After he graduates, he hopes to teach at a 4-year college and help reform science education to be more interactive and reflective of what real scientists do. In his free time, Kevin can be found biking, brewing beer, and trying not to forget his Japanese.
